WHAT IS A CAP?

Since 1993, Lubrizol's Painesville Township facility has been bridging the gap between industry and the community with its Community Advisory Panel (CAP). The group consists of residents, educators, officials, and company representatives. We meet regularly to discuss what is happening at the plant, educate members on what Lubrizol does, and to address community concerns.

As part of the Responsible Care® initiative, the CAP helps focus on two-way communication between Lubrizol and our neighbors. We, as representatives of the community find out what is happening at the plant, and the company representatives get insight into community activities and concerns.

More than twenty-nine years later, our group's impact on the community can be seen in Lubrizol's communication with its neighbors. With our feedback they've been able to define what areas to focus on in their communications to the public. Some examples include:

- translating brochures into Spanish.
- tours and Q&A sessions of the site for our local neighbors
- providing feedback regarding topics and content for community newsletters.
- creating a "What to do when the Sirens Sound" video.

Beyond the CAP's initiatives in emergency preparedness, we are looking at ways to improve communications with the community as a whole and to share the information we learn during our regular meetings.

The CAP's willingness to work with Lubrizol has helped the company communicate important information to residents and has raised community awareness.

MISSION STATEMENT

The community advisory panel (CAP) is a partnership between Lubrizol and its neighbors to positively impact the health, safety, and environmental concerns of the community. Through education and open communication, the panel promotes trust and commitment in addressing issues of common interest.

What we have learned about Lubrizol and its commitment to the health and welfare of its neighbors and employees...

- Lubrizol's commitment to Responsible Care
 - Lubrizol conducts its business according to the principles of Responsible Care, a voluntary program to achieve improvements in environmental, health and safety performance.
 - Working with community advisory panels, they communicate with neighbors about their operations and progress.
- Lubrizol's Emergency Response capabilities
 - In addition to their regular duties, many
 Lubrizol employees participate in the plant's
 emergency response organization as
 responders, emergency medical technicians
 or paramedics. There are qualified
 personnel in the plant around the clock to
 handle emergencies.
 - Lubrizol employees train side-by-side with other community fire departments to ensure teamwork and coordination among those responding to emergencies. A few employees are volunteer firemen and EMTs, using their skills and knowledge to serve their communities.

PARTNERING ACTIVITIES

Some examples of the CAP partnering with Lubrizol include:

- The CAP hosted a panel discussion with leaders from our local emergency planning committee, safety forces and school district on emergency preparedness.
- Participating in emergency preparedness drills as observers and role playing as media interviewers.
- Working at Lubrizol's booth at Party in the Park handing out information regarding sheltering in place.
- Shelter in place education subcommittee developed video and training for area schools and facilities.
